ZACTS School Fish Farming Project

Since 2018, the ZACTS School for Orphans and Vulnerable Children, in Solwezi, Zambia, has been running a farm on its property to raise funds for the school's operations and provide nutritious food for the students. Currently, they grow cabbage, tomatoes, corn, and onions, and raise broiler chickens and cows for meat and dairy. However, with the dramatic increase in the student population, feeding them and raising funds for operations is challenging!

After completing a pilot project in fish farming some years ago and staff just finishing a training course in fish farming, our partners are eager to expand and create a new income-generating venture. This project aims not only to supply the students with protein but also to sell the fish at the market and teach pupils about fish farming. Fish consumption has increased enormously in Zambia as consumers are wanting white meat instead of red meat.

To achieve this, they plan to construct a 20x20 metre fishpond on the school property and start with 3,000 tilapia fingerlings, a climate-resilient fish that is rich in nutrients like Omega-3 fatty acids, vitamins, and minerals. Tilapia farming will also diversify the school's agriculture program, reducing dependence on crops and providing a reliable income source. The school curriculum will be adapted to offer students in grades 8-12 the opportunity to learn about aquaculture, with a focus on fostering entrepreneurship.

Chickens at Bella Ciao are Impacting the Community



The successes haven't gone unnoticed, catching the attention of the wider community. Bella Ciao has been receiving more visitors, ranging from curious neighbors to aspiring entrepreneurs. They're fascinated by what's been achieved and are eager to learn. It's amazing to see how this project is empowering not only the children and staff, but the entire community!

Bella Ciao is a remarkable safe house and drop-in centre in Kawangware Slum in Nairobi, Kenya. Here, children are rescued from abuse and violence and instilled with hope through education, psychosocial development, and emotional support. The Chicken Coop Project was introduced to provide a sustainable food source for the children and to equip them with valuable practical skills for their future.

As a result of your contributions to the Baskets of Love Campaign, construction of a chicken and animal coop has been completed. This coop is now home to 100 chicks, 2 turkeys, and 30 rabbits. To ensure the animals' wellbeing, all necessary vaccinations and fumigations have been diligently administered, guaranteeing a healthy and hygienic environment.

Training sessions were organized for 26 children and staff members, covering all aspects of animal care, including cleaning, feeding, and egg handling. The children take turns caring for the animals, with staff members offering supervision, guidance, and enforcement of safety protocols.

One child who has developed a passion for the animals is Shantel. After coming to the centre from school, she immediately heads to the coop to ensure the animals are well-fed and happy before even considering her own supper. This devotion has not only had a positive impact on her life but has also inspired her peers, creating a ripple effect of enthusiasm among the other children in the program.



On June 3rd, Women Making a Difference held a 5k Walk for Water to raise funds for a water project in the drought-ridden community of Kona, Burkina Faso. Then on July 21st, members of the Bonavista Church in Calgary, who were inspired by the event, held a similar walk in their community. **With everyone's involvement, you surpassed the fundraising goal!**

Thank you so much to everyone who was involved in this initiative. The funds raised will soon bring significant

positive change, as women and girls in Kona, Burkina Faso will no longer have to trek long distances to get water, improving health and wellness in the local community.
