### A Year of Hope at the Kamlapur Drop-In Centre

The Kamlapur Drop-In Centre in Bangladesh has officially been open for one year! This centre is a special place dedicated to helping children who live and work on the streets around the Kamlapur Railway Station. Thank you for your unwavering support for this program. You've already made a significant impact on the lives of these vulnerable children, and we're thrilled to share some of the milestones that have been reached at the centre over the past year:

- When the centre initially opened, just 3 children were able to read and count. Today, that number has risen to 15, and program leaders say that 13 are ready to transition into formal education! It's important to note that these children still work daily and have limited time for studying, so it will take some time for others to reach this level. Nevertheless, we are proud to share that every child can now write their own names.
- The children reside and work at the Kamlapur Rail Station, where they sleep on the ground and use public bathrooms for washing. When the children

- began attending the centre, around 20% of them required treatment for scabies. **Today, that number has dropped to just 2%!** The children now have access to medical care, bathing facilities, and the ability to wash their clothes.
- At first, it was challenging for program leaders to determine whether children living and working on the streets would be dedicated to coming to the centre and pursuing education. There are now
   22 children who consistently attend the centre every day! Because of their dedication to improving their circumstances, the next goal for the centre is to provide them with a place to stay so they can go to school. Keep an eye out for updates on this exciting development!

Her goal is to take on child marriage in her community and be an advocate for girls just like her sister.

# Seeds of Success Zambia

In late 2022, International Needs Zambia launched a Women's Co-op Pilot Project. The goal of this project was to empower 10 women whose children attend the ZACTS School for Orphans and Vulnerable Children. They received training in maize cultivation and running farming businesses. Now, they have maize for their families, earn income, and have improved their financial management skills.

Because of the pilot project's great success, ZACTS will soon launch a new Women's Co-op Project that will benefit 50 women! This time, the project will encompass several opportunities: 17 women will focus on maize production, 16 will be involved in raising chickens, and 17 will grow cabbages, tomatoes, onions, and potatoes. The broader scope aims to provide a range of income-generating options for the women and create an even more sustainable and well-rounded initiative.



We would like to give a special thanks to the group of donors who are fully funding this project! Your support will make a significant and positive difference, not only for the women involved but also for their families and the entire community.



Meet Mary, a member of the original Women's Agricultural Co-op in Zambia. Recently, the women in the cooperative finished bagging the harvested maize and also planted new crops of winter maize. Mary's hard work paid off, yielding 21 bags. She plans to set aside 4 bags for her family's consumption, allocate some to the ZACTS School kitchen, and sell the rest at the market. This couldn't have come at a better time because Mary has just welcomed a baby boy into her family! **She's** overjoyed because now she has enough food to feed her loved ones and some extra income in her account, which will help cover various necessities for her children. With gratitude in her heart, she prays for blessings upon those who have provided her with this invaluable support!
